Seniors

“Leading through experience and maturity”

Seniors are the most experienced members of the band program. As such, you bring a wealth of experience and maturity to the rest of the membership, and have a duty to use that experience and knowledge in helping to develop the younger members of our organization. This is your year to influence the others with your experience and wisdom.

A student’s senior year is a year of leadership. It is the culmination of years of band experiences and traditions that must be passed along in a positive and productive manner. This is not an either/or situation. This is what must be done. This is not a “coasting year,” but is just the opposite. It is your busiest year. Your senior year, you are expected to “step up” and fill the shoes of all the student leaders that have come before you, and add your “name” and experiences to the traditions that have made our organization what it is today.

Our band program is today... what our students make it.

Seniors are expected to:

- Assume leadership roles when necessary

- Fill all duty roster leadership spots
- Be the first to learn and pass off all music and drill
- Remain respectful of all underclassmen
- Tutor the freshman musicians on music and drill
- Remain a positive influence on the rehearsal process
- Assist the assigned student leadership whenever possible

Seniors may have meetings with the leadership as needed to discuss needs and ideas that will promote the well-being of the entire band program.

Juniors

“Lead through example and by actions”

Juniors are the second-most experienced members of the band program. You also bring experience to the rest of the membership and have a duty to use that experience and knowledge in helping to develop the younger members of our organization.

While juniors have experience, you are also still “learning.” You, as juniors, should be turning your eyes to the future leadership roles that await you during your senior year. You should be watching and observing the things that work well, as well as those that do not, making note on how to improve the process for your senior year. You should attend as many leadership training clinics and seminars as possible. You should try out for as many music related activities as possible (All County Band, All District Band, All State, Solo & Ensemble, etc.).

Juniors are expected to:

- Assume leadership roles when necessary
- Remain respectful to seniors and senior leadership
- Be a positive and encouraging influence to all sophomores and freshmen
- Fill all duty roster spots when needed
- Be among the first to learn and pass off all music and drill
- Tutor the freshman musicians on music and drill
- Remain a positive influence

Sophomores

“Making a difference through developing and nurturing”

Sophomores are generally second-year members of the band program. You bring a year of experience to the rest of the membership.

While sophomores have one year of experience, you are also still “learning.” You, as sophomores, should still be focusing on developing your own skills and concentrating on making yourselves the best you can be. As such, you are not necessarily ready for, nor should you assume by default, any leadership role, until

asked to do so. You should consider attending as many leadership training clinics and seminars as possible. You should try out for as many music related activities as possible (All County Band, All District Band, All State, Solo & Ensemble, etc.).

Sophomores are expected to:

- Fill all duty roster spots when needed
- Pass off all music and drill as soon as possible
- Be a positive and encouraging influence to the freshman class
- Be respectful of the junior and senior leadership classes
- Remain a positive influence on the rehearsal process
- Assist the assigned student leadership and seniors if needed

Freshmen

“Making a difference through learning and growing”

Freshmen are the newest members of the band program. You are on the threshold of a lifetime of new experiences.

All of the coming band experiences are “brand new” to the freshman class. The experience you have this year will likely set the tone for the rest of your band career. Be positive and patient. You will amaze yourself at how much you will have learned, developed, and grown by the end of the year. You, as freshmen, should also try out for as many music related activities as possible (All County Band, All District Band, All State, Solo & Ensemble, etc.).

Freshmen are expected to:

- Fill all duty roster spots
- Pass off all music and drill in a timely fashion
- Be respectful of upperclassmen
- Remain a positive influence on the rehearsal process
- Learn as much as you can, as fast as you can

Academics

Extracurricular Activity Eligibility Guidelines

The Tuscaloosa County Board of Education recognizes the value of extracurricular activities as they relate to the total education of the students; however, the students' pursuit of their academics must be first and foremost and take a priority over participation in extracurricular activities.

In order for students in grades 10 through 12 to be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities during and academic school year, the students must, for the immediately preceding school year, have maintained a passing grade in each of at least six Carnegie unit credit courses and a composite numerical average of 70 for all of the Carnegie unit credit courses.

In order for students in grade 9 to be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities during an academic year, the student must, for the immediately preceding school year, have a passing grade in at least five subjects with a composite grade average of 70 or higher in the five courses.

Of the courses used to determine eligibility, students must have credits for at least four core curriculum courses (English, Science, Social Studies, and Math). A student may be exempt from the core curriculum requirements if the student is otherwise on track with the Tuscaloosa County Board of Education graduation requirements in the core curriculum courses.

The use of up to two Carnegie unit credits and the accompanying cumulative grades obtained during summer school may be used in computing the credits needed for eligibility.

At the end of each grading period, the head coach and/or sponsor of each extracurricular activity shall check the current grades of all students participating in their extracurricular activity. If a student fails to maintain a passing grade in all of his/her courses during the preceding grading period, the student will be placed on probation from extracurricular activities.

When a student is placed on probation, the head coach and/or sponsor will notify the principal. The principal, or designee, will then meet with the student (and the student's parent/guardian if deemed necessary" to implement a required academic remediation program to address the academic performance of the student.

When a student is on probation, the principal may also mandate modifications in the student's participation in extracurricular activities if the principal feels that the modifications is necessary to insure the student's ability to increase his/her academic performance during the probation period.

If, at the end of a subsequent grading period, the student makes another failing grade in the same subject, the student must show evidence of satisfactory participation in the remediation program in order to maintain participation in all extracurricular activities. A student who fails to show evidence of satisfactory participation in the mandated remediation program will automatically be suspended from all extracurricular activities.

Grading

Grading for the Tuscaloosa County High School Band varies depending on the number of performances that fall within a particular grading period, and the nature and character of outside rehearsals and performances.

While a point system will be used, **required performances will count for a minimum of 40% of a student's nine weeks grade**, regardless of the points accumulated.

Ideally, each individual would be evaluated on his/her progress throughout the entire year and will be, when feasible. Realistically, students are graded on attendance at rehearsals and performances, and on whether or not required materials have been passed-off.

Tutoring Program

The Tutoring Program has been established to take advantage of the academic opportunities within the band program for those students who wish to do so. Every year several of the Honor Graduates, Valedictorians, and Salutatorians are selected from the Tuscaloosa County High School Music Programs. The Tutoring Program is designed to help pair these academic achievers with those in need of help. Students may make a request for assistance from the director who will, in turn, pair that student with an academic tutor. Tutoring sessions are to take place outside of class and/or rehearsal time. However, if the student feels it is merited, then rehearsal and/or class time will be available for tutoring.

*If we believe that we become better by surrounding ourselves with successful people, and recognize that environment plays an important role in our success, then students should strive **to stay in musical organizations because of their grades**, and not quit those programs because of the time spent in preparation for them.*

The director will monitor all students' grades and may place students in the tutoring program before requested to do so by either the student or the parent.

Membership

Marching Band

Enrollment at Tuscaloosa County High School is required of all students in the Tuscaloosa County High School Band program. This includes all members of the Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, and Jazz Band (some exceptions for the jazz band may apply for instrumentation needs pertaining to the rhythm section). The band program is very much a team/group where the participation of a single individual directly affects all other members. Therefore, all members must assume their responsibility to the organization and fully participate in as many activities as may be required of them. A student may be excused from participation in the marching band if they are involved in another school-related activity that directly conflicts with rehearsals and/or performances on a regular basis (Football, cheerleading, and girls' volleyball).

Wind Ensemble

The Wind Ensemble is a select group of instrumentalists dedicated to the study, understanding, and performance for standard symphonic band and wind ensemble literature. Orchestral transcriptions are studied and performed. Music difficulty varies from grade levels 4, 5, and 6.

Students may be considered for membership when one or more of the following criteria have been met.

- Audition for and score acceptably for All State Band
- Audition for and score acceptably for All County Band
- Participation in Solo & Ensemble
- Completion of all twelve major scales and arpeggios
- Study with a private teacher (or substitute another individualized improvement program)
- Teacher recommendation

Symphonic Band

The Symphonic Band is a large group setting dedicated to the study, understanding and performance of standard symphonic band literature. Orchestral transcriptions and original band compositions are studied and performed. Music difficulty varies from grade levels 2, 3, and 4. Students may be considered for membership when one or more of the following criteria have been met.

- Teacher recommendation

Band Techniques

Band Techniques is a small rehearsal setting where students can focus on specific performance problems. Students will also use this time to pass off required music and to receive more individual instruction not possible in large group settings.

Jazz Band

The Jazz Band is a select group of instrumentalists dedicated to the students' understanding and performance of standard jazz band literature. Students are expected to study and perform the many different styles associated with the jazz idiom. Music difficulty varies from grade levels 2-6. Improvisation is studied and encouraged among all students. The instrumentation for the jazz band is a set number. Students may be considered for membership when positions become available. Membership is by invitation of the director. When one or more students desire consideration in a particular position, then auditions will be held.

Pep Band

The Pep Band is a small group of instrumentalists who will perform at certain school and community functions where it is not appropriate or feasible to use any of the other ensembles. Students are expected to serve in the pep band a minimum of twice per year. Performances for the Pep Band will include but are not limited to:

- Athletic Events
- City-wide functions

Rehearsals

Rehearsals are mandatory if a student expects to participate in any performance. A student should not miss rehearsals and expect to perform. Individual performances will count 40% of a student's grade. Unexcused absences will receive a grade of zero.

Students who miss a rehearsal must have either a school excuse or a doctor's excuse.

Any student with unexcused absences to rehearsal may be subject to the following disciplinary actions:

- 1. Suspension from performances**
- 2. Dismissal from band**

Dismissal from band will require a schedule change and the student will not participate in any facet of the band program.

Marching Band

Rehearsals are vitally important to the success of any program. Summer rehearsals tend to move very quickly and cover a lot of material. Students who are absent miss this opportunity and, in reality, are rarely able to catch up.

Band Camp is required of all students involved in all facets of the marching band. Rehearsals are from 7:00 AM to 1:00 PM for two consecutive weeks.

After-School Rehearsals are held Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday from 3:30 to 5:00 PM. Students are expected to attend all rehearsals.

Students who miss one rehearsal a week with an excused absence may perform with the approval of the director.

Students who miss two or more rehearsals in a week with an excused absence may not perform.

**** Doctors' appointments that cannot be scheduled during the school day must be scheduled for Wednesdays. ****

Sectionals

Sectionals may be called in order to review music and/or marching assignments. Sectionals will generally be held immediately at the conclusion of marching band rehearsals, but will not extend past 6:00 PM.

Wind Ensemble/Symphonic Band

Students may be required to attend one section rehearsal per week at the conclusions of the marching season. Grades will be given for attendance and sectionals are required for performance in concerts.

All State Band

The purpose of the All-State Festival is to distinguish the most outstanding band members in the State of Alabama and to give them the opportunity for a musical experience of the highest caliber.

The All-State Festival will include four bands; Red Band, Blue Band, White Band, and Junior High Band. Those students with the highest scores will be assigned to the Red Band, next highest scores will be assigned to the White Band, and the next highest scores will be assigned to the Blue Band. Students in the ninth grade and below will be eligible to audition for either the Junior High Band or the other bands, but no student may audition for both.

All-State Jazz Band is available to those students who are actively participating in Jazz Band. Audition requirements are available from the director.

Auditions are normally held during the month of January.

District Honor Band

The purpose of the All-County Band is to distinguish the most outstanding band members in the Alabama Bandmasters Association, District V, and to give them the opportunity for a musical experience of the highest caliber.

The District Honor Band will include two bands; High School Band and Junior High Band. Auditions will be held in March of each year. All Tuscaloosa County High Band students may be expected to audition for District Honor Band. The results from this audition may be used for chair placement in Symphonic Band and Wind Ensemble. The auditions occur during the All State Audition.

Honor Bands

Students will have the opportunity to submit applications to many of the various honor bands sponsored by state universities. Selection into these groups is solely the right and responsibility of the host university and should in no way reflect upon the recommendations or quality of the students within the Tuscaloosa County High School Band program.

Because of the vast number of honor bands throughout the school year, each student and parent will be responsible for making their own travel and lodging arrangements.

Students who are selected for an honor band are expected to fulfill that commitment. Failure to do so may limit the students' ability to apply for other similar activities.

Football Games

Students will receive an itinerary before each game, which will detail times and expectations for all students. It will be the students' responsibility to adhere to and follow those times and guidelines.

Inspection

Students may go through a uniform inspection prior to every game. Students will be expected to have: required shoes polished, tall black socks, stand music, extra reeds (if required), and horn polished. Failing inspection can result in cleaning the band room or other service-related deeds.

Stand Rules

1. Only play with the band! No unorganized "doodling" and/or "pecking".
2. No food or drinks are allowed in the stands.
3. No visitors from outside the band allowed into the band section.
4. All members should stay within their sections in the position designated by their leader.
5. Cheer as a band and with the cheerleaders. No "cross" or "click" cheering.
6. Be ready to play **at all times**. Do not set your horn down. Hold it in your hand or lap!
7. Students will be allowed to visit the restrooms before the game and during the third quarter. **Students will not be allowed to visit restrooms during the first half.**
8. Students need to make certain that they eat before reporting to the band room to dress in uniform.
9. **Stay in uniform at all times!!!**

Act with the class and dignity that a person from Tuscaloosa County High School and Northport, Alabama should have.

Attendance

Band is a group activity and rehearsals are vitally important to the growth and quality of our organization. All students depend on one another to be there to do their part for the enhancement of all members through a quality performance. All students are expected to attend all rehearsals and performances understanding that, at times, it means putting the needs of the group ahead of personal concerns. A student should not have joined band for their own convenience.

Concerts

All concerts are the culmination of the skill, knowledge and talents developed in and out of school. Concerts are extensions of the school day and therefore are co-curricular in nature. All concerts are required by all members of the band.

Individual performance will count at least 40% of a student's nine weeks grade for the grading period in which the performance falls.

Marching Band

Marching band rehearsals begin in July on the first Tuesday after Independence Day. These weekly rehearsals are not mandatory, but are strongly encouraged. Mandatory rehearsals begin with Band/Music Camp and continue through the remainder of the school year.

Performances

Performances are at every football game throughout the football season including any and all post-season games. The band will also perform in two or three marching contests per year which are held on Saturdays. Students who miss a performance must have either a school excuse or a doctor's excuse.

Any student with an unexcused absence to a performance may be subject to dismissal from band.

Sectionals

Sectionals may be called by either the band director and/or the section leaders. Attendance to sectionals is mandatory when notice is given in a timely manner.

Marching Band Sectionals

- May be called in order to review music and/or marching assignments
- Generally held at the conclusion of marching band rehearsals, but will not extend past 6:00

Wind Ensemble/Symphonic Band Sectionals

- Students will be required to attend one section rehearsal per week at the conclusion of marching season
- Grades will be given for attendance
- Sectionals are required for performance in concerts

Competitions and Festivals

Marching Band Contests

The marching band may participate in up to three marching contests each fall. The purpose of the contests is to allow the band and all components of the band to be evaluated by qualified adjudicators on the quality of their performance.

State Competition Festival

The purpose of the State Competition Festival is to give qualified bands the opportunity to be evaluated and constructively criticized by a panel of qualified adjudicators. A panel of three adjudicators will be selected and will evaluate the performance of each band. Bands will be given ratings (I – Superior, II – Excellent, III – Good, or IV – Fair) by each adjudicator.

Regional/National Competition Festival

The band may be selected to enter into a regional and/or national level festival on a yearly basis. Such contests will usually be held in conjunction with any spring trip that may be planned. Symphonic band festivals will be open to all students in Symphonic Band and Wind Ensemble who meet the criteria to attend.

Solo & Ensemble Festival

The purpose of this festival is to encourage band students in a Festival in order to broaden their musical education. Students will perform an approved piece of music for a judge who will then assign a rating of I, II, III, or IV.

Chair Placement

Chair placement within a given section is vital to those students who wish to advance and desire the opportunity to do so. Advancement may be obtained through two methods: Chair Auditions and Challenges.

Chair Auditions (Individual Evaluations)

Chair auditions will be held twice per school year. The first audition will be held in November following the Fall Concert, and the second may be in January in conjunction with All State Try-outs or another locally held audition. Chair auditions are required, and failure to audition will result in a substantial decrease in the individual's nine weeks grade.

Students will be ranked according to the score received in the audition. Those students who refuse to audition will be seated alphabetically after the last person with an audition score. Students who transfer in will be evaluated by the director and seated accordingly. Fall chair placement will take effect immediately upon conclusion of the audition and before Christmas Concert preparation. The second chair placement will take effect immediately before State Contest and/or before any other regional contest the band may be participating in, but before Spring Concert preparation.

Awards

Service Award

Service awards will be given periodically to students who perform a service and/or services to the band above and beyond the active participation in rehearsals. Such activities may include, but are not limited to: field clean-up, bus captain, taking care of PA and/or ladder at rehearsals, field markers, uniform box managers, taking care of water at rehearsals, librarian, loading crew, pit helpers, etc.

Pride Award

Pride Awards are given periodically to those students who have, by a consensus of their peers and teacher, demonstrated through deed and action those qualities most sought after by the membership of the Tuscaloosa county High School Band program.

John Philip Sousa Award

The John Philip Sousa Award is a nationally recognized award given to a senior in recognition of outstanding achievement and interest in instrumental music and for singular merit in loyalty and cooperation and for displaying those high qualities of conduct that school instrumental music requires.

Louis Armstrong Jazz Award

The Louis Armstrong Jazz Award is awarded to jazz students who have displayed outstanding achievement on their instrument through superior musicianship, character, and individual creativity.

Outstanding Musician Award

Outstanding Musician Awards are given at the end of the school year to the student(s) who has demonstrated through performance and leadership that he/she is the “Best of the Best” on their particular instrument at Tuscaloosa county High School. Selection is by consensus of the students and the approval of the director.

Most Improved Musician Award

Most Improved Musician Awards are given at the end of the school year to the student(s) who has demonstrated through performances that he/she excelled to a high degree on their particular instrument. Students selected for this award may not be the best in their section, but have achieved more skill than others in the given amount of time. Selection is by consensus of the students and the approval of the director.

Discipline

Tuscaloosa County Code of Conduct

The Tuscaloosa County Code of Conduct is the principle guide for disciplinary action and standards for all students in the Tuscaloosa County School System. The code of conduct will be in effect during all band functions, formal or otherwise, at all times on or off campus.

Extracurricular

In as much as band is a co-curricular activity, it does have an extracurricular component to the program (i.e. marching band, dance team, color guard, and majorettes). Some disciplinary action may be deemed necessary that is not governed by the Tuscaloosa County Code of Conduct. Such actions may include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Running laps
2. Cleaning the band room and/or practice field
3. Cleaning buses after away performances
4. Suspension from performances
5. Suspension from band and/or auxiliary team for remainder of year
6. Suspension from band and/or auxiliary team for one calendar year

Such actions may be taken for, but are not limited to the following infractions:

1. Lack of cooperation
2. Failure to properly wear uniform
3. Insubordination
4. Disrespect show to the director, instructors, sponsors, student leaders, adult volunteers, and classroom teachers
5. Unexcused absences to either rehearsals or performances
6. Conduct unbecoming a band member
7. Use of alcohol, drugs, or tobacco products

Student Leaders

Student leaders are a vital and necessary part of the band infrastructure. They are necessary to the teaching and discipline process of the band. A student leader's authority is a direct link to the band director, sponsors and instructors, and all subordinate students should act accordingly.

Student leaders, from time to time, will make requests of their sections and/or subordinates. All students are expected to comply with those requests. Should a subordinate student feel that a request made by a student leader is unreasonable, then that individual should bring it to the attention of the band director in a timely manner.

Leadership Requirements/Clinics

Students who wish to assume leadership roles will be asked to attend and complete designated training sessions. Certain tasks must be mastered before students will be eligible to assume leadership responsibilities. Such tasks may include, but are not limited to:

- Passing off required scales
- Attending and watching various videos
- Attending local clinics
- Demonstrating appropriate teaching techniques
- Anything else that the director deems necessary to leadership development

Duty Rosters

All students will be required to help with various aspects of the band program in order for the program to run smoothly. The following is a list and description of possible duties that may be required of students.

Yard Markers

Responsible for setting up and picking up yard markers before and after each marching rehearsal.

PA System

Responsible for setting up and taking down of portable PA system before and after each rehearsal.

Loading Crew

Responsible for loading and unloading the equipment truck before and after every performance.

Field Maintenance

Responsible for lining the practice field

Water

Responsible for providing water for the band at rehearsals and at performances as directed by the band director.

Field Clean-Up

Responsible for keeping up the band practice field and surrounding area picked-up and free of litter.

Rear Area Clean-Up

Responsible for keeping the area directly behind the school picked-up and free of litter.

Band Room Maintenance

Responsible for keeping the band room clean and picked-up.

Uniform Committee

Responsible for the organization, distribution, and collection of band uniforms.

Pride Committee

Responsible for recognizing those students who are deserving of recognition for service which best exemplifies the meaning of "Pride" as it pertains to the Tuscaloosa County High School Band

Podium

Responsible for setting up and taking down the drum major's podium at each rehearsal.

Bus Captain

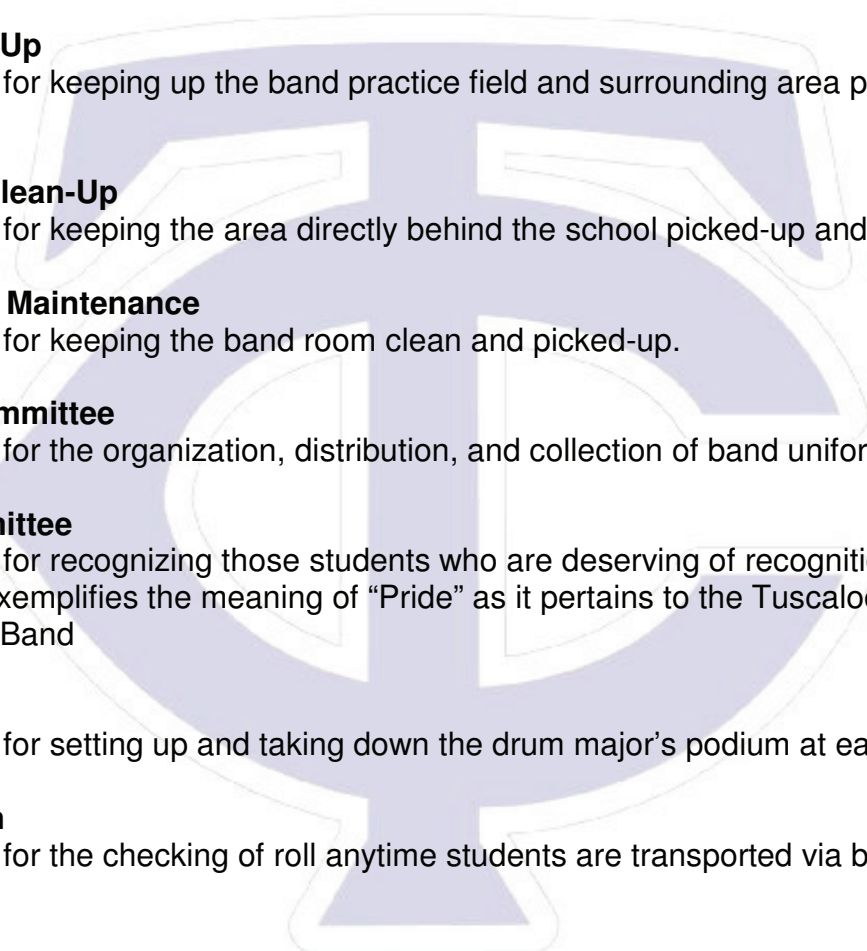
Responsible for the checking of roll anytime students are transported via bus.

Security

Responsible for securing the band room before, during, and after outside rehearsals.

Prayer Coordinator

Responsible for the selection and coordination of all prayers and devotions before all performances for those students who wish to participate.



Lockers

Instrument lockers will be provided for students at no charge. The director will assign lockers based on the size of the instrument. Students should keep their lockers orderly and free from trash at all times. Under no circumstances should students keep food or other products that would attract insects.

School-Owned Equipment

The band does provide equipment rental for the larger band instruments and for percussion. The rental rate is included in the yearly band fees per person per year, regardless of the number of instruments the student may be assigned. Students will assume responsibility for the care and maintenance of the instrument while in their possession.

Transportation

Transportation to all band activities will be via Tuscaloosa County School bus unless other charter arrangements have been made by the proper school authorities.

Only Tuscaloosa County High School Band students and the designated chaperones will be allowed to ride the buses.

Students will ride to and from all activities with the band.

Students will not be released until all equipment and uniforms have been properly stored. Students will be dismissed by the band director.

Parents may sign their child out during roll **call at the conclusion of an event, with the band director's approval**. No one other than the parent will be allowed to sign a student out. This is for everyone's safety. Parents may not send a note requesting that their child ride home with someone else. Only the parents may sign their child out and only their child.

Procedure to sign out students:

1. Parents will meet the band director at the buses during roll call
2. Parents must have a note stating that they are taking their child
3. Note must be initialed by the band director
4. Parents will then take the note to the appropriate chaperone, who will collect the note and release the child to the parents.

All rules and regulations pertaining to school bus behavior and expectations will be observed as per the Tuscaloosa County Code of Conduct.

1. Students will not be allowed to eat or drink on the buses
2. Radios, MP3 players, and CDs are permitted **only with headphones**

3. Students will obey the bus driver and chaperones at all time, showing the courtesy and respect expected from a Tuscaloosa County High School band member

Students assume full responsibility for the security of their possessions on the bus. Students will not be allowed to carry personal items to the performance area, nor should they expect chaperones to care for their personal property.

Bus Drivers

Bus drivers are selected on a year-to-year basis. The band uses buses for all games, home and away, and for various contests throughout the school year.

Pay rates for bus drivers are set as per Tuscaloosa County Board of Education policy.

Chaperones

Chaperones are selected on an event-to-event basis. Chaperones are to ride on the buses with the students and to help out as needed with transporting equipment, etc. chaperones are there to help the students and the organization to run smoothly by helping in whatever areas may need attention. A chaperone's first priority is always the welfare and the safety of our students. Second priority is the logical needs of the organization.

Uniforms

Ownership

Uniforms are owned and maintained by Tuscaloosa County High School Band. Maintenance includes all cleaning and repairs within normal usage by members of the band. A uniform rental and cleaning fee is included in the cost of yearly fees.

Auxiliary members who are instrumentalists in either Wind Ensemble or Symphonic Band will pay ½ the uniform rental and cleaning fees annually, which is included in the annual fees for band membership. Students who transfer in will pay rental and cleaning fees on a prorated basis, depending on the time of year in which they transfer and the number of performances remaining for the school year.

Tuscaloosa County High School Band does not own the auxiliary uniforms. Those uniforms are owned and maintained by the individual auxiliary member.

Displaying

The uniforms worn by the members of the Tuscaloosa County High School Band are an outward and visible sign of the pride and dedication of our organization. It is a visible symbol of that for which we stand and the standard of excellence that we try to achieve and maintain. The public recognizes and judges us by how we look as a group. When in uniform, we as individuals are acknowledging that we are a part of an organization and will conform to the needs and wishes to the betterment of that organization. As such, the uniform shall always be worn in a manner consistent with these beliefs and high ideals.

1. Students will pick-up and return uniforms before and after every performance from their assigned uniform storage place (box or closet). Students must properly return the uniform (i.e. hanging properly on hanger and in the correct order).
2. Students will wear only approved clothes under the band uniform (i.e. shorts and t-shirts provided by the band). Students will arrive at all performance sites wearing these clothes in order to change into the uniforms.
3. Students will not eat, drink, or chew gum in uniform unless directed to by the band director.
4. Students will refrain from public displays of affection while in uniform.
5. Students will remain in full uniform as directed by the band director. Coats are to remain buttoned and collars fastened unless told otherwise by the band director.
6. Students may not ever display the uniform in a haphazard, casual, or unsightly manner.

Repair/Replacement

Uniforms are routinely repaired and replaced by the Band Boosters. However, in the event that repairs are required and parts need to be replaced due to negligence on the part of the student, that student may be charged for the repairs and/or replacement parts.

Band Boosters

The Tuscaloosa County High School Band Boosters are the support organization for the Tuscaloosa County High School Band Program. They contribute support personnel, chaperones, concession stand workers, and hundreds of other duties, all vital to the success of the Tuscaloosa County High School Band. Simply paying fees and dues that are required, and providing the students are not enough to make the program successful. Most children are more successful in any endeavor when the parents get involved with their lives.

Fee Structure

Band Fees

Band Fees are required of all students participating in any area of the Tuscaloosa County High School Band Program. The fees for each student are as follows:
